## 2023 Consolidated Election Brings in New Village Board Members

The April 2023 Consolidated Election resulted in a new Village President, Amber Kubiak, who previously served as Trustee (2017-2023), replaced outgoing President, Steve Wiedmeyer. Steve Wiedmeyer served on the Village Board for over 25 years – as Trustee from 1996-2015, and then President from 2015-2023. Luke Hall was re-elected to a four-year term, while Joe Hirschbein continues to serve the remaining two years of his term. Four new Trustees were elected – Adam Hagg, and Christopher Romano, to serve four-year terms in seats vacated by Charles Pearson, Trustee from 2013-2017, and then 2019-2023, and Michael Mette, who served the unexpired one-year term of Raul Lemus, who resigned in 2021. Edward Tarnow, was elected to serve the remaining term of Patricia Dulkoski, who resigned in the fall of 2022; Dave Kupczyk, appointed by Steve Wiedmeyer, served in Ms. Dulkoski's vacated seat up until the April election. With Ms. Kubiak being elected President, the remaining two-years of her previous Trustee seat was appointed to Ms. Brook Carey.

## Pingree Grove Now Sponsors Ride in Kane



Pingree Grove partnered with Kane County Division of Transportation and Pace Suburban Bus, becoming a local sponsor of Ride in Kane (RIK). Under Pingree Grove's sponsorship, RIK will provide public paratransit transportation service for seniors age 65+ and individuals with disabilities living within the corporate limits of Pingree Grove, with trips to medical appointments and grocery shopping. Eligible residents must register in person at the Village Municipal Center between the hours of 9:00 am – 4:00 pm Monday – Friday. As a RIK sponsor, the Village has allocated \$25,000 in funding towards the cost of transportation for qualified trips within Kane County, for a cash fare of \$5 one-way for the first 10 miles, and \$1.50 per mile thereafter, or up to five (5) miles into McHenry County, including access to Northwestern Medicine Huntley Hospital.
