VILLAGE OF PINGREE GROVE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS 2025 CONSOLIDATED ELECTION - APRIL 1, 2025

The Village of Pingree Grove will conduct Consolidated Elections on April 1, 2025, for the following Village Board positions:

1. Village Trustee – four-year term expiring 2029
2. Village Trustee – four-year term expiring 2029
3. Village Trustee – four-year term expiring 2029
4. Village Trustee – remainder four-year unexpired term 2027

Eligible candidates must live in the Village for one (1) full year, be a registered voter, and satisfy other eligibility requirements as observed by the Illinois State Board of Elections.

Consolidated Election petitions may NOT be circulated prior to August 20, 2024. Petitions must be completed, signed, and notarized, prior to submitting to the Village Clerk during the filing period. To avoid the appearance of impropriety and to ensure fair electoral board hearings, the Village Clerk or other Village notary staff may not notarize election petitions for candidates seeking office in the Village of Pingree Grove.

The Village Clerk's office will accept **completed candidate nomination packets** at the Village Municipal Center (555 Reinking Rd., Pingree Grove, IL 60140), through the **filing period of November 12, 2024 – November 18, 2024**, during regular business hours of 8:00 am to 4:30 pm (and until 5:00 pm on the last filing day) Monday through Friday, less the lunch hour of 12:00 pm-1:00pm. The Village Municipal Center is not open Saturday or Sunday; nomination packets will not be accepted at times when the Village Municipal Center is closed.

NOTE: *The Village will **NOT ACCEPT** any petition for filing after 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the filing period. This applies to any individual(s) waiting in line as of the 5:00 p.m. deadline who has not yet filed their petition(s).*

Nomination Papers Shall Consist of:

- ✓ Statement of Candidacy P-1B
- ✓ Nomination Petition Sheets P-3
- ✓ Statement of Economic Interest – Filing Receipt
- ✓ Loyalty Oath P-1C (optional)

Compliance with the applicable law in having the petitions for candidacy signed, notarized, and submitted along with other required documents in a suitable format pursuant to SBE candidates guide, is the **sole responsibility of the candidate.**

Simultaneous filings of candidate nominating **petitions for the same office** occur for those candidates **in line at 8:00 a.m.** at the office of the Village Clerk. Petitions sent by mail (United States Post Office only) and received **AFTER midnight** of the first day for filing, and in the first U.S. Postal Service delivery of that day, shall be deemed filed as of 8:00 a.m. Candidates who file by mail and who wish to qualify for the lottery, must mail petitions to the attention of Village Clerk, Village of Pingree Grove, 555 Reinking Rd., Pingree Grove, IL. Nominating petitions received through other delivery systems are not considered “mail” and will not be included in the lottery. It is important to note that petitions received BEFORE the first day of filing cannot be accepted. Simultaneous filings can also occur during the last day of filing **during the last hour** of the filing deadline between 4:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. An approved State Board of Elections lottery system will be used to break ties of simultaneous filings. Ballot position for all subsequent filings is determined by time and date received.

STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS STATE OF ILLINOIS

ARTICLE 29B FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES ACT

10 ILCS 5/29B-5. Purpose. The Legislature hereby declares that the purpose of this Article is to encourage every candidate for public office in this State to subscribe to the Code of Fair Campaign Practices. It is the intent of the Legislature that every candidate for public office in this State who subscribes to the Code of Fair Campaign Practices will follow the basic principles of decency, honesty and fair play in order to encourage healthy competition and open discussion of issues and candidate qualifications and discourage practices that cloud issues or unfairly attack opponent. (Source: P.A. 86-873.)

10 ILCS 5/29B-10. Code of Fair Campaign Practices. At the time a political committee, as defined in Article 9, files its statement of organization, the State Board of Elections, in the case of a state political committee or a political committee acting as both a state political committee and a local political committee, or the county clerk, in the case of a local political committee, shall give the political committee a blank form of the Code of Fair Campaign Practices and a copy of the provisions of this Article. The State Board of Elections or county clerk shall inform each political committee that subscription to the Code is voluntary. The text of the code shall read:

CODE OF FAIR CAMPAIGN PRACTICES

There are basic principles of decency, honesty, and fair play that every candidate for public office in the State of Illinois has a moral obligation to observe and uphold, in order that, after vigorously contested but fairly conducted campaigns, our citizens may exercise their constitutional right to a free and untrammelled choice and the will of the people may be fully and clearly expressed on the issues.

THEREFORE:

- (1) I will conduct my campaign openly and publicly, and limit attacks on my opponent to legitimate challenges to his record.
- (2) I will not use or permit the use of character defamation, whispering campaigns, libel, slander, or scurrilous attacks on any candidate or his personal or family life.
- (3) I will not use or permit any appeal to negative prejudice based on race, sex, sexual orientation, religion or national origin.
- (4) I will not use campaign material of any sort that misrepresents, distorts, or otherwise falsifies the facts, nor will I use malicious or unfounded accusations that aim at creating or exploiting doubts, without justification, as to the personal integrity or patriotism of my opposition.
- (5) I will not undertake or condone any dishonest or unethical practice that tends to corrupt or undermine our American system of free elections or that hampers or prevents the full and free expression of the will of the voters.
- (6) I will defend and uphold the right of every qualified American voter to full and equal participation in the electoral process.
- (7) I will immediately and publicly repudiate methods and tactics that may come from others that I have pledged not to use or condone. I shall take firm action against any subordinate who violates any provision of this Code or the laws governing elections.

I, the undersigned, candidate for election to public office in the State of Illinois or chairman of a political committee in support of or opposition to a question of public policy, hereby voluntarily endorse, subscribe to, and solemnly pledge myself to conduct my campaign in accordance with the above principles and practices.
